Feis rules.

1. The Feis will run in accordance with the Rules of An Coimisiun le Rinci Gaelacha.
2. Entries will only be accepted from persons currently registered with An Coimisiun for the years 2018/2019.
3. All competitions are open to dancers from all regions.
4. The lodgement of an entry will be taken to mean that a teacher and pupils understand these rules and undertake to abide by them.
5. Age will be taken as on 1st January 2019 (whatever age you turn this year, in 2019, you dance under that age all year long, e.g. if your date of birth is 1st of January or 1st of May or 1st of September 2009, you dance under 10 in the year 2019). Evidence of age may be requested, therefore dancers should have a valid ID with them in the event of a query as to their age
6. Beginners Grade competitions are confined to dancers who have never won 1st or 2nd prize (also 3rd prize, please refer to rule 8) in any competition for that particular dance. In Beginners Grade competitions only basic steps may be performed.
7. Primary Grade competitions are confined to dancers who have never won 1st prize (or 2nd prize, please refer to rule 9) for that particular dance other than in Beginners Grade.
8. If a Beginner competition has 6 or more dancers, the first two places advance to the next grade, regardless of ties. If a Beginner competition has 11 dancers or more, then the first 3 places advance to the next grade regardless of ties. (RCCEA-RTME ruling Sept. 2007)
9. If a Primary competition has 6 or more dancers, the first place advances to the next grade, regardless of ties. If a Primary competition has 11 dancers or more, then the first and second places advance to the next grade regardless of ties. (RCCEA-RTME ruling June 2011)
10. Intermediate Grade competitions are open to all dancers who have not previously won first prize for that particular dance in Intermediate or Open Grade under the same or higher age limits. If a dancer in Mainland Europe wins in Intermediate, they must advance into Open for the rest of that calendar year. If they do not win in Open, they may return to Intermediate at the start of the next calendar year. (RTME ruling Sept. 2007)
11. Where there are five dancers or less for Beginners, Primary and Intermediate competitions the results will not affect their grading.
12. For all Beginner, Primary and Intermediate competitions (excluding trophy competitions) the 32 bar method will be applied. All Championship dancers will be required to dance 48 bars of music in the reel and jig and 40 bars in the slip-jig and hornpipe. Two and three hand reels are danced to 40 bars of music. Ceili dances are subject to the rules applied at Oireachtas with a choice of A or B part in the 8-hand ceili dances.
13. Primary and Intermediate Trophy Competitions will be a choice of either heavy or light dance. Dancers will dance 16 bar down the line in their chosen dance.
14. In Treble Reel competitions dancers will dance 32 bars down the line to 113. Hand movements are permitted in this competition.
15. Premier Championships will be judged as two solos and then an overall Championship. Dancers have a choice of heavy jig/hornpipe in heavy round, and choice of reel/slip jig in light round (only reel available for the male dancers). If they do not dance a set dance, they will be excluded from the championship result, but they will be judged in the solo rounds. If there are more than 9 dancers in the competition there will be a recall for the set dance round. In Under 7 Championships competitors will dance 40 bars of music in the Reel, Light Jig and Single Jig. In Under 8 Championships dancers will dance 40 bars of music in the Reel and Single Jig plus any traditional set dance. In Under 9 Championships dancers will dance 40 bars of music in the Heavy Jig and Reel plus any traditional set dance.

16. Intermediate Cup is open to Intermediate/Open level dancers who have never won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd place in Open Championship level and to dancers not participating in a full Open Championship at the same feis. Dancers will be required to dance either Reel (32 bars) or Slip Jig (32 bars) for ladies and Reel (32 bars) for gents in the light shoe round, plus either Heavy Jig (32 bars) or Hornpipe (32 bars) in the heavy round. Third round is a Traditional set. If there are more than nine dancers in the competition there will be a recall.

17. Traditional Set Dance competitions are a choice out of 7 traditional dances: St. Patrick's Day, Blackbird, Job of Journeywork, Garden of Daisies, King of the Fairies, Jockey to the Fair and Three Sea Captains. If you win grading place in any traditional set dance competition, you move on the next level in all 7 traditionals. The advance rule works as in rule 9.

18. We are offering a Special Trophy competition which is a Traditional Cup Championship. It is open to all levels, the dancers are required to know all 7 traditional set dances which will be performed in 3 rounds. We are also offering a Non-traditional set dance competition, open to Intermediate/Open level dancers. Winning any of these 2 competitions will not affect any grading.

18. Music will be played at the recognized An Coimisiun speeds for Mainland Europe:

19. Team dances (four hands and upward) must be performed in accordance with the Coimisiún handbook "An Rinci Ceili" (2014).

20. Within the limits specified in the Rules of An Coimisiún the organizers may at their discretion split or combine competitions with insufficient or too many entries.

21. Objections must be lodged in writing within one hour of the announcement of the result of a competition accompanied by a fee of €40, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.

22. **Order and quiet must be kept in the hall**, particularly while competitors are dancing.

23. Food and drink must not be consumed in the hall. Smoking is forbidden at the venue.

24. **Use of video/photo/mobile phone etc. cameras in the hall is not permitted** except in Beginner & Primary competitions and results (CLRG Ruling Dec.2011). Flashlights use is forbidden during the competitions. During Intermediate and Open competitions photographs may be taken by the official feis photographer only. **Mobile phones must be in silence mode or switched off** during competitions.

25. Competitors must be in costume and ready to dance **30 minutes before** their competitions are scheduled.

26. The Adjudicator's decision is final.

27. Only Feis officials may approach the adjudicator during competition sessions.

28. An Coimisiun has ruled that from 1st January each year, that no block, en pointe, stationary or moving, be allowed to be performed for all ages up to and including the under 12 age group worldwide. The Under 12 Age Group will be allowed to toe walk from September 1st of the year prior to this date.

29. All Beginners and Primary dancers of all age groups may only wear a class costume, simple dancewear or appropriate attire (skirt and top/blouse, simple dress for girls and ladies, trousers and t-shirt/shirt for boys and gents. Makeup will not be permitted for any dancer in the first two grades up to and including the Under 12 age group worldwide. It is absolutely not permitted for dancers in either solo or team competitions up to and including Under 10 age group (CLRG Ruling Feb.2014).

30. The dress code in accordance with An Coimisiun rules will be strictly observed. For the sake of modesty and in the interest of safety to young people, dancers will not be permitted to walk around the

Feis scantily dressed. Please refer to CLRG Costume Rules.

31. Female adult dancers participating in competitions entitled «adult competition» and/or «adult grade competition» (both solo and team) are required to wear opaque black tights of a denier not less than 70.

32. No refunds will be made.

33. The Feis organisers cannot accept any liability for injuries sustained or loss or damage to property or belongings which may occur during the Feis.

34. By entering in competitions, dancers (or their legal representatives, in case of minors) consent to their names being stated in the feis results and in the public Internet archives of Feisbase or any other feis entry/results system as may replace it.
